International Social Standards

Planning and implementation of projects in accordance with internationally recognized social standards is critically important in terms of the sustainability of projects and the management of their social impacts. The basic principles of international social standards, how they are applied in project management, and the alignment and differences between national legislation and international standards will be presented as general information.

Social Impact Assessment

An introduction will be provided to topics such as identifying the impacts of projects on social life, managing potential socio-economic risks and ensuring social sustainability, the basic concepts of social impact analysis, the importance of stakeholder engagement, and compliance with national and international standards.



Resettlement and Livelihood Restoration

In infrastructure and construction projects, permanent and temporary land acquisition may necessarily be required. There are international standards established for compensating and minimizing the impacts on the daily lives and livelihoods of the owners and users of acquired lands, such as IFC, EBRD, and WB standards. An introduction to planning and practices for the identification of right holders and the development of socio-economic strategies in line with these standards constitutes the content of this training.

Stakeholder Engagement

Stakeholder engagement plays a critical role in the sustainable implementation of projects that have national and international standards. In this context, topics such as who the stakeholders are and how they are analyzed, how stakeholder engagement strategies will be developed, and what the differences are between national legislation and international standards will be addressed.

Labor and Working Conditions

Basic information will be provided on the monitoring and evaluation of labor management and working conditions in the design and implementation stages of projects according to international standards, the management of the workforce, the assessment of working conditions, and the differences between local legislation and international standards.

Gender-Based Management

It is based on the need for projects to adopt an effective and conscious management approach in the processes of ensuring gender equality and empowering women. Basic concepts and practical solutions will be presented in order to understand gender dynamics, develop fair implementation strategies, and establish institutional and social equality-based structures.
